



Best Practices for Setting up Equipment

This document walks you through the process of setting up the examinee's tablet for testing with the WJ V.

Optimal settings for Examinee's tablet:
Set tablet to Kiosk mode
Lock in the tablet in portrait mode
Set auto timeout to "never"
Turn off the keyboard sounds
Turn off notifications
Turn off Chrome Extensions
Setting up your workspace

1. Setting up Riverside Score Examinee portal in Kiosk Mode

Putting an iPad in kiosk will lock down the decide to a single application, ensuring users can
only interact with that application. Follow the steps in this document to easily set up kiosk mode
on your iPad and keep it sure.



Setup Riverside Score Examinee Portal Site

Step 1:

Launch Safari browser and enter "https://riversidescore.com/examinee" URL in the address bar.

Click on the arrow box icon to the right of the address bar.



Step 3:

Click on the "Add to Home Screen"

Step 4:

Click on "Add" link on the top right of the popup

Step 5:

Confirm that the "WJV Examinee Portal" icon shows up on the home screen.

2. Lock Tablet in Portrait Mode

- Open Control Center by swiping down from the top right corner of the screen
- Tap the Portrait Orientation Lock icon, which looks like a lock with an arrow around it



When the feature is turned on, the icon will be highlighted in red

3. Set Auto Timeout

- From Settings, select Display & Brightness
- From Auto-Lock select Never



4. Turn Off Keyboard Sounds

- From Settings, select Sounds
- Turn off keyboard clicks

5. Turn Off Notifications

• To turn off all notifications during a testing session, turn on "Do not Disturb mode". This will stop all notifications from coming through.

6. Turn off Chrome Extensions

- Open Chrome
- Click the three dots in the top right corner
- Select "More tools" then "Extensions"
- Toggle the switch next to the extension you want to disable to the "off" position

Frequently Asked Questions Regarding Kiosk Mode:

What happens if I forget the passcode?

If you forget the passcode, you'll need to restart the iPad and use your device passcode to exit Guided Access.

· Can I use any app in kiosk mode?

Yes, any app can be used in kiosk mode. Just open the app before starting Guided Access.

· Can I disable certain touch areas on the screen?

Yes, you can disable specific areas by circling them on the screen when setting up Guided Access.

Will Guided Access work on all iPad models?

Guided Access works on any iPad running iOS 6 or later.

• Can I exit Guided Access without the passcode?

No, you must enter the passcode to exit Guided Access mode.
